She will also participate in the Fox Valley Arts Ramble on April 21 and will show at the Geneva American Legion through the Greater Geneva Arts Guild. Kathie continues to show regularly at the Gallery 200 in West Chicago, and will teach watercolor classes this winter.

**Peter Hagerty** will have a portrait exhibit of his paintings at the Westmont Public Library from March 3 to April 1. The show is titled "Faith and Meaning – Chicago's Irish Heritage."

Artist member **Suzanne Poursine Massion** is featured in a New York Times article, published February 11, 2018 in the Business Day section. The story is titled "A Lifetime of Making Art, but New to Selling It Online" by journalist Amy Zipkin. Suzanne was interviewed in December of last year about the difficulties and challenges she's faced in the marketing and selling of artwork online. Suzanne says, "After consigning and selling my paintings with traditional brick and mortar fine art galleries since 1991, I was in a whole new world with all the online venues out there. My biggest success has been with only one site since 2015, but it's been a big learning curve. I'm still learning. It was exciting having a New York Times reporter contact me and conduct an interview by phone. Then the Times sent a photographer out to my studio to take a ton of shots. All very thrilling".

# **Board Notes**

The Treasurer reported that there's lots of activity in the membership renewal department. The Membership VP added that we had received \$16,000 by the date of the board meeting for a



total at that time of 331 new or renewed memberships which is ahead of where we were last year at this time.

We received an additional \$5,000 from the Driehaus Foundation which is wonderful! A brand new laptop was purchased for the art league with Carbonite and Quickbooks on it that will be used by the treasurer.

Along with the good news, the board also learned that the water heater in one of the classrooms sprung a leak over the break and has to be replaced at a cost just over \$900. More good news though – The bank is going to have the people who clear the Annex sidewalk also shovel the sidewalk at 218.

The VP of Publicity has begun looking into revamping our website. She will be doing research over the next 6 months and plans to present options to the board in August or September. There will be an upcoming Artisan Afternoon on marketing your artwork with a speaker from Arts DuPage. The date has not yet been set.

Art in Gallery I has been selling really well. Fourteen pieces have been sold since May. Yuletide Treasures was very successful this year and brought in over \$13,800. Of course, we only get a portion of that amount but it was the best number we have seen for many years. The Co-VP's of Exhibits put together recommendations on how it can be made even better for next year.

The by-laws are being reviewed. A committee made recommendations and the board is in the process of reviewing them and reporting back.

# **Board Notes**

- The financial picture is sound. Memberships have been coming in at a solid rate. There has been a substantial increase in gallery sales over the last six months. The Life Drawing class on Saturday afternoons has more than doubled in size. Operating costs are down.
- Mary Dorrell reported that the website has been updated with all the new information for 2018. Work continues on an Artisan Afternoon in March on how to market your artwork. Mary attended a workshop on grant writing that contained a wealth of information and has been working with Finance VP Dan Anderson on his project to pursue grants to upgrade our technology including our computer system and possibly our website.
- We have a new water tank and the faucet in the small classroom was fixed so there is now hot water on the right side. Chuck Showalter is getting a proposal for additional work.
- A new membership brochure is almost ready to print. The brochure features the artwork of several teachers and members and is bright and colorful.
- The new slate of officers will be announced at the next program. All slots are filled.
- The new chair of Community Exhibits, Nancy Morris, will be doing a survey of the artists in the program to get more information about how the program is working and what improvements should be considered.
- Twenty-five people attended the last program on a night when the weather was really bad. The presenter for the next program (Wes Douglas on Urban Sketching) has invited people who follow his work to attend and wondered how many people we could seat. After counting chairs, Sue Thomas determined we could handle 75. It would be great to have that kind of turnout.
- Adult classes are going well and many filled immediately when the schedule opened. Children's classes have more openings and there was discussion about what could be done to increase enrollment.
